For His glory...

All sin should be mourned and grieved; not celebrated. (1-2a)

Elders should courageously remove all $\underline{willful}$, $\underline{blatant}$, $\underline{ongoing}$, $\underline{unrepentant}$ sinners from the fellowship of the church. (2b-5)

Believers should <u>cleanse</u> themselves from even the <u>smallest amounts</u> of immortality by focusing on the Lord. (6-8)

Believers should cut off contact with immoral professing believers. (9-13)
