Sermon Questions Hebrews 10:1-25

This week we challenged believers to believe their blessings. In the church, we often encourage people to count their blessings, perhaps even enjoy their blessings, but it's rare when Christians truly believe their blessings and live differently as a result. Through Christ's death, burial and resurrection we have been offered a new life. While it's imperative to talk about the necessity of the cross it's just as imperative to talk about our new life in Christ. We have the hope of Christ in us and with that hope we have so many blessings that God wants us to have and enjoy. A thorough understanding of Hebrews 10:1-25 will instill confidence, freedom, joy and hope in the life of a believer. Take the time to ponder these truths from God's Word and live the Christ-centered life God intended for you.

Here are some notes to review from this week's sermon...

Believe Your Blessings Hebrews 10:1-25

Believe your blessings in the new...

Covenant because of Christ's <u>life</u> (1-18)

Confidence because of Christ's provision (19-20)

Conscience because of Christ's **blood** (21-22)

Confession because of Christ's <u>faithfulness</u> (23)

Consideration because of Christ's transformation (24-25)

Questions

1. Why should we enjoy the New Covenant? Was there a problem with the Old Covenant? What did the Old Covenant do? What was it unable to do? How was this insufficiency rectified by Jesus Christ?

- 2. What does it mean that believers in Christ are now perfected as they are being sanctified? Does God literally see believers as positionally perfect now? Will believers one day in the future really be perfect? What does that truth do to your soul?
- 3. How forgiven are believers through the New Covenant? How many times did Jesus have to sacrifice himself? How many sins did Christ die for? How many people did Christ die for? Why is Christ's forgiveness such an important topic?
- 4. What is the significance of the New Covenant being gracious? Internal? Experiential? Personal? Forgiving? Present?
- 5. What kind of confidence should we have in approaching God? Who is our all-access pass? What is the significance of Christ preparing a way for us to experience God's presence? Who could experience Christ's presence under the Old Covenant? Who can experience Christ's presence now?
- 6. How confident are you to boldly come before the throne of grace? Why? How important is the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ in your life? How important should His presence be in your life?
- 7. Discuss your favorite Scriptures on identity? How frequently should you review who you are in Christ? How important is it for a believer to know and live their identity?
- 8. What is the significance of a clean conscience? How cleansed is a believer at the moment of conversion? What remnant of sin remains for a Christian once he repents and believes in Christ?
- 9. What sins has God cleansed you from? As Pastor Jeff read the alphabetized list of sins what were you considering? How powerful is it to understand that all your sin is forgiven? How powerful is it to understand as believers we are COMPLETELY cleansed?
- 10. Do you truly see yourself as a saint? Redeemed? Holy? Righteous? Good? Adopted? Accepted? Loved? Cherished? Etc.? Why or why not?
- 11. What is our confession of hope? Why must we live with a present certainty of future realities in our life even though we can't see it? Why is faith an imperative for the believer?
- 12. Why is it easier to believe God for other people? What do you need to believe God for right now? What Scriptures are you presently holding onto right now? Read Proverbs 13:12. Why is hope an essential ingredient for growth in Christ?
- 13. What is an area of your life where you are praying, "Lord I believe...Help my unbelief!" Why is this such an important and faithful prayer?

- 14. What are we called to stimulate in other believers? Why are we called to help other believers grow in love and good works? How can we do a better job of this task?
- 15. What does it mean that we are NOT to forsake the assembling together? Why is church attendance so important? Why should we make it our practice to attend church? When it comes to church, why should you see yourself as a contributor and NOT a consumer?
- 16. How did God speak to you this week? What is the application you need to make in your life RIGHT NOW?
