Sermon Questions Exodus 3

This week we discussed how when God sees a problem and has a solution, he goes looking for that man in order to make him a worshipper. Often when we consider the notion of worship our thoughts wander to liturgy and style rather than to the person of Jesus Christ. Worship is when a person gives their full allegiance in all areas of their lives to the Lord Jesus Christ. God wants us to seek Him first and yet so often we want to simply have God in the background just to help if we encounter problems in our journey. God wants to be our God. God wants us to know and fear Him and yet also recognize His mercy and grace that overflows abundantly! In this study of Exodus 3 we seek how God reveals Himself to Moses and how God wants to use his life. God has been active in Moses' life from the time He was born but now is growing deeper in His understanding of the Lord. Our patient God wants us to know Him as the Sovereign Creator who is all powerful and Transcendent, loving God who cares for every area of our lives! May this week's message challenge you to become a greater worshipper of the Lord Jesus Christ!

1. In God's workshop, why does He want to make worshippers? What is worship? How does worship please the heart of God?

- 2. How does worship change our relationship with spiritual disciplines? Why is a worshipper more likely to tithe, study God's Word, pray, and even evangelize?
- 3. What is the purpose of evangelism? Why does God want more worshippers? How does our own personal worship effect our ability and fruitfulness in our witness? What does John Piper mean when he says, "Global Missions exist because worship doesn't?"
- 4. What does it mean that God is holy? How is God's holiness an important aspect to remember and reverence?
- 5. Why should we desire to gather for worship? Why will no one in heaven choose an online option for worship? Why should online worship not be our first choice?
- 6. Why should we celebrate the mercies of God? How has God shown you mercy in your life? Where do you need to experience more of God's mercy in your life? Where would you be without God's mercy? Where has the devil told you that you cannot receive God's mercy?
- 7. What does it mean to you that God wants to use you despite all the ways you have failed him? How wonderful is our God is showing mercy?
- 8. What does "I am who I am" mean? Who is this God speaking from the burning bush? How do you know? How personal and powerful is our God? What does it mean that He will always be with us? What is the significance of knowing that God will be powerful in your life today? Where do you need to experience His power?
- 9. How would your life be different if you walked in the power of God? What do you need to believe today about the power of God?
- 10. What does it mean to obey God's calling on your life? What does it mean to fulfill God's calling on your life? Why should we fulfill God's calling on our life as though people's lives depend upon it?
- 11. How ironic is it that the Hebrew word for slave and worship are the same? What is the difference between being a slave of Christ and a slave of something or someone else?
- 12. How can you grow in your worship?
- 13. What is your greatest take-a-way from this week? What do you need to apply to your life right now?
